Another significant distinction is one, not reflected in the census data, between the resident population and the migrant population. Natufa municipal records for 1980 indicate a total estimate of 5,000 population divided into:

3,750	residents	(Muqimeen)	75%
1,500	refugees	(Naziheen)	15%
250	emigrants	(Mughtaribeen)	10%

Since the distinction between a 'resident' and an 'emigrant' is established rather subjectively in the municipal tax records, and the former category includes a substantial number of the population who are "temporarily" abroad (e.g. college students), the actual number of village permanent residents (first two categories) are considerably less -- as I
